- Refrain from blocking air vents as this can unbalance the HVAC System.
- Regularly check the HVAC system and maintain cleanliness.
- Maintain relative humidity below 60%
- Refrain from using products that can cause Indoor Air Quality problems such as chemical based fragrances.
